Viewing and writing: Being cyber smart

Hector's world offers students practical guidance on managing risks and reinforces the importance of responsible online behaviour. Your child may have watched these animations before at school, but this is an opportunity for you and your child to discuss online safety.

There are five animated clips to watch. For each clip, ask your child to record the key messages and have him/her answer the questions below:

The questions:

- What is personal information? Who should it be shared with? How can it be used?
- How can you protect yourself and your personal information online?
- Who can you trust to support you online? Who should you check with before sharing your personal information?
- How do you know when a situation is unsafe or when a person is not to be trusted?
- What techniques ('tricks') are used online to find out your personal information?

Next fortnight, your child will be provided with instructions about how to present their information.
