New building project

This time last year we were announcing the construction of the inclusive playground on Brooke St and this year it is our new gymnasium and classroom building. We have spent what seems like hundreds of hours in meetings over the past 18 months to get us to this stage. I am sure you will agree that moving the portables out and the fourth portable to the carpark has made an enormous difference to the feel of the Clarke St site. The location of the new building project gym and classrooms will be where the original Clarke St building was located back in 1924 at the front of the Clarke St boundary. It is very fitting that the new building will commence 100 years later in the same location. This does mean that the turf area at the front of the school will be built on, and as mentioned in previous correspondence we will be losing some of the trees in the forest area. These will be replaced with suitable alternatives as part of the project. The project is currently out to tender and once the tender process is finalised the builders will be onsite quickly. This will mean we will lose access to the Clarke St carpark and the turf area at the front of the school. The access to the school grounds via the gate closest to the kindergarten will be maintained but this may change throughout the build. We are very excited that the project is about to commence and while we will have some short-term pain, we will have many years of benefit from the new buildings. I would like to thank the parents who advocated for funding for our school and who worked hard on the Redevelopment Working Party to develop the capital works funding submission. The fruits of your labours are about to be reaped!

What's been happening in S.T.E.A.M in term 4?

Year 3's- Sphero Indi has been the tech we have been using this term so far. Students can program these robots using coloured mats. Later in the term we will be designing and building a Town for the Indi cars to drive around. This will involve teamwork, design, building and maths concepts such as angles to ensure the car navigates the course successfully.



Year 4's- digital art. Groups have been creating digital art on the iPads.

Groups are also completing mini coding projects such as making a spinning top and a Simon Says game using the SPHERO Bolt.

Later in the term, groups will be designing and building mini golf courses.



Year 5's- Animations on the iPads. Groups have been working on animations using the Apple Pencils. Groups will complete projects using the SPHERO Bolt to code an alarm clock and make a soccer game.



Year 6's -

This term Year 6s have been finishing off Scratch projects, Chariots to race and OSMO games. Later in the term, groups will be coding a 3 Little Pigs story acted out with SPHERO. They will also be learning about binary code and networks.



Code club Friday Every Friday lunchtime the WEB building is open for Code Club. Groups can work on finishing projects, starting new ones, or have fun coding.

Lights for learning incursion. Grade 5's participated in an incursion to make solar lights for communities in need in PNG. After the lights were constructed, groups wrote a little message to the student who would be receiving the light. Year 5's had lots of fun and whilst learning about solar, will have hopefully made a difference in someone else's life.

<u>Finance</u> – The Finance Committee meet monthly to discuss the previous month's financials. Detailed financial reports are provided to committee members for review and discussion.
