CHILD SAFE STANDARDS


ENGLISH – READING

In Year 2, Reading involves teaching and nurturing a love of reading

- Accuracy, fluency, comprehension and vocabulary skills are taught and developed
- Partner reading
- Modelled reading (class novel, watching and listening to you and their teachers read)
- Independent reading
- Reading to an adult
- Mentor texts









ENGLISH – WRITING

In Year 2 Writing, our aim is to have the students see themselves as writers and to give them chances to publish and celebrate their work.

5 lessons per week

- Explicit handwriting
- Spelling (including LLLL revision)
- Genre
- Grammar and punctuation
- Presenting
- Whiteboard work









MATHEMATICS

In Year 2 Maths, students develop fluency and understanding.

6 lessons per week

- Active teaching, purposeful games and puzzles, challenging maths tasks and maths investigations
- Topics taught in blocks & reviewed throughout the year
- Differentiated teaching/tasks

SPANISH

SPANISH / VISUAL ARTS

Visual Arts and Spanish are taught together. The program follows the Content and Language Integrated Learning model (CLIL).

The focus of such a pedagogical model is to deliver learning outcomes for all students in both Content/Art and Language/Spanish by providing a meaningful context for purposeful language learning.

Art

Students will have one fifty minute session per week.

Throughout the year students are introduced to the Spanish vocabulary for colours, the materials and actions in the art room. They learn to introduce themselves and express their emotions with others.



Grade 2 MUSIC PROGRAM

All grade 2 students attend 1x 50 minute music session per week.

During music lessons, students will engage in a wide variety of musical activities aimed at developing creativity and fostering a love of music and movement. In 2025, John Carr will be teaching 2 Amanda and 2 Madeline. Simon Lewis will teach 2 Rachel.

Students will:

- Use their imagination and voice to create and perform music
- Use instruments to create and perform music (percussion, xylophones, the glockenspiel)
- Make decisions about organising sounds to communicate ideas (eg create a storm soundscape)
- Describe how moods and effects are created in musical pieces through listening and discussion
- Describe their understanding of the purposes of music (entertainment, ceremonies, religious and cultural)

The highlight of 2025 will be the whole school musical production in term 3, giving students to opportunity to perform onstage under lights at the Darebin Arts and Entertainment Centre. Details will be announced later in the year.

PETWYEAR 2

A CHANCE TO BE PHYSICALLY ACTIVE, CHALLENGED, AND TO HAVE FUN!

Activities that incorporate fundamental movement skills – movements that use different body parts.

Completing *movement sequences* in response to stimuli - e.g. participating in a series of ball throws with a partner.

Describe how our *body responds to movement* - e.g. increased heart rate and blood flow, brain becomes activated, mood improves.

Focus on *values* - including cooperation, following rules, fair play, and displaying sportsmanship.

Learn how to keep ourselves and others healthy, safe and physically active.

HOW YOU CAN SUPPORT YOUR CHILD

O Compass

- Used to communicate whole school and year level specific information
- Enables parents/carers to log student absences
- Provides opportunity for parents/carers to communicate with their child's teacher
- Schedule and view parent/teacher interview appointments
- Provides access to student reports

Two Compass kiosks are available for signing students in or out of school during the day, one at the front office on Brooke St. and another in the WEB on Clarke St. No students are to access the kiosks.



Seesaw


